

WHAT WE HAVE ACCOMPLISHED in May 2016 - May 2017



HOUSING-RESIDENTIAL

Received an award from the Michigan State Housing Development Authority for the building of 9100 Gratiot (aka—Gratiot Central Commons). This will be our largest development touting 45 units and 4 stories.

We have also acquired property in the Milwaukee Junction. The old Stanley's Chineese Mania on Baltimore and the property directly behind it on Milwaukee.

ANTI-RACISM WORK

We held two evening conversations on racism. First with Tim Wise and secondly with Fr. Bryan Massingale. These two events brought about a three part conversation on racism training in which 60 individuals participated.



EPIPHANY EDUCATION CENTER

Epiphany has completed its twelfth year of educational tutorial ministry to students in grades 1-8. With the assistance of 9 certified teachers, 5 high-schoolers and 5 adult volunteers, over 40 students have been serviced on a one-on-one basis. This year they hosted a Wine Tasting fundraiser and had lots of support from the community!

The director is Roslyn Taylor.

SENIOR NETWORK

In 2016, the Senior Network traveled to Niagara Falls, and to Cincinnati OH. During the network trips the Senior had an opportunity to shopped, dine, walked, read, rested, laughed to visit about African American history and, of course, visit the nearest casino.



2017 trips include New Buffalo, MI; Washington D.C. and Toronto.

COMMUNITY ACTION COMMITTEE

Has worked in many areas including with Wayne State University's Applebaum School of Pharmacy in helping to recruit African American Students to the program, as well as the annual election push trying to educate voters and to get the to the poll.

The Committee called the DCPA parishes to assist with water for Flint, MI as well as an awareness for the thousands who have had their water shut off here in Detroit.
